This is a triage centre where someone from the Street Homeless team will assess. Open for assessment Monday, Wednesday, Friday 9.30 - 11.00.

It is open every weekday as a drop in centre.

Those needing accommodation are first referred to:

Patrick House, 361 Millbrook Road, Southampton SO15 0HW. Tel: 023 8078 1721.

This is for emergency accommodation, can stay up to 8 weeks, and are helped with a move on plan. Patrick House is a 56 room assessment hostel for emergency accommodation.

Full-board catered service, shared facilities, 24 hour on site support, all clients supported by a Key Worker during their stay.

May be referred to hostels, eg Salvation Army, or to private landlords, or to Society of St James if they have problems with addictions.

If no rooms are available they are encouraged to stay with friends or family until accommodation can be arranged.

Salvation Army

The Booth Centre, 57 Oxford Street, Southampton SO14 3DL. Tel: 023 8033 0797 For single, homeless people. Can take 3 couples. There are 43 rooms in total.

Age range: 18 – 60 years

Persons have to be referred by the Homeless Team, and have probably been to Patrick House first. The usual stay is up to 12 months, but may be anything from 4 weeks to 2 years.

They have key workers who help with finding accommodation.

No Limits

No Limits is a partnership with Street Safe, Chapter 1, Southampton City Council & Probabation For persons under 26 years old.

A charity offering free and confidential information, counselling, advice about housing.

It has a rent deposit scheme, and can match a person with a private landlord if they take part in their Access to Tenancy (A2T) course.

There is a Welfare Benefits Advisor by appointment on Wednesday and Friday morning. This provides for washing, showers, food, clothing.

iii – 406 Portsmouth Road, Sholing, Southampton SO Also, no washing facilities.



Chapter 1: Christian Alliance (CAHA)

Provides accommodation and support for homeless, vulnerable people & refuges for domestic abuse. for young people 18 - 25.

Referrals from local social services or agencies (eg Street Homeless or No Limits); sometimes accept self- referrals.
